2016 Japanese Direct Investment Survey: Summary of Ohio Results


The Consulate General of Japan in Detroit annually surveys Japanese-owned facilities and Japanese nationals in Ohio. As the 2016 data indicate, Japanese investment contributes significantly to state and local economies.

- 482 facilities in Ohio are supported through Japanese direct investment.
- These facilities employ a total of 73,434 people in Ohio, the most of any Midwestern state.
- Japanese investment supports more jobs in Ohio than investment from any other country.
- Total employment at Japanese facilities has grown every year since 2010.

FACILITIES

The majority of Japanese facilities (265) are manufacturers, 51% of which are automotive-related. There are 111 commercial trade operations, accounting for 23% of all facilities.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

The central region's 142 facilities, which provide 28,989 (40% of total) jobs, are mostly automotive production related. Other areas of the state, such as the southwest and northeast, are home to Japanese businesses in a diverse range of sectors including chemicals, pharmaceuticals and rubber.



EMPLOYMENT

98% of jobs at Japanese businesses in Ohio are held by Ohioans. 58% of these jobs are manufacturing, as well. Total employment has grown 30% since the Great Recession, surpassing the pre-recession peak in 2012 and continuing to grow in the years since.
